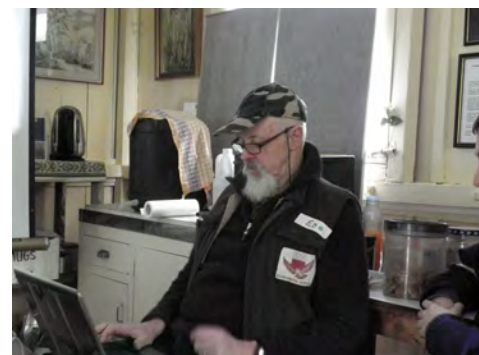

We had the opportunity to hear about Trust for Nature's conservation covenants and the complementary work being undertaken in the surrounding region through the Port Phillip & Westernport CMA's Yarra 4 Life.
