Rob Jones, Natural Resource Planner, Cardinia Shire Council, welcomed the participants and thanked them for their environmental contributions during the past year.

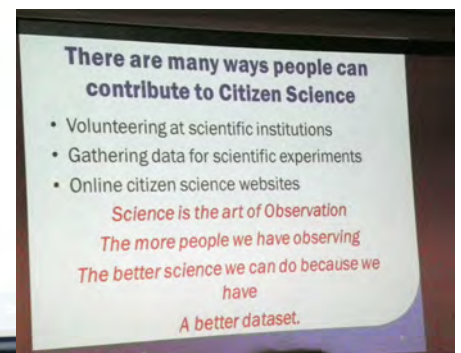
Marianne Sawyer, Cardinia Environment Officer, spoke a about the work done together with volunteers in the Shires Reserves.

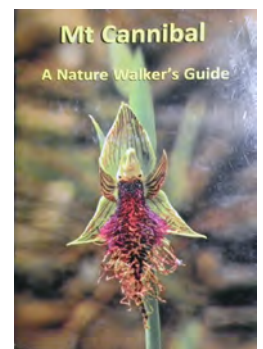
Heather Callahan, Team Leader Recreation and Facilities, talked about Citizen Science, explaining how it works and how individual can contribute by gathering data.

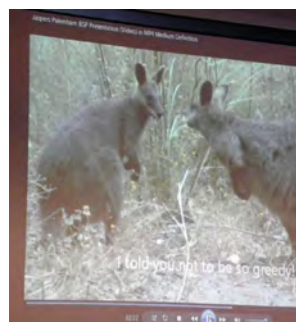
