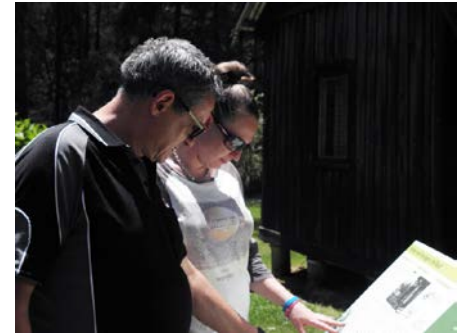
On arrival everyone signed the Volunteer Activity form and had a quick look around the Kurth



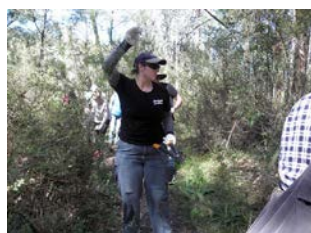
Marijke reading the safety analysis and explaining what where we were going and what was to be done
